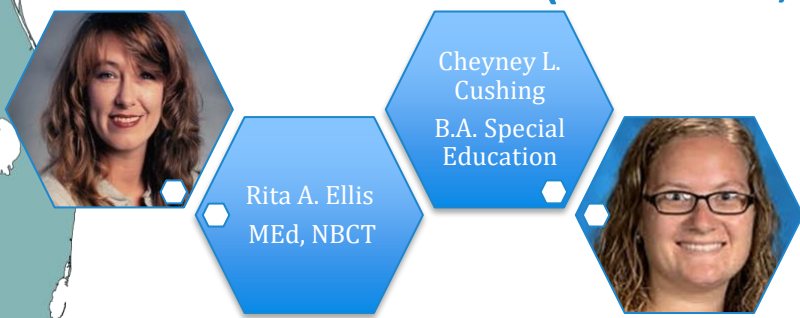
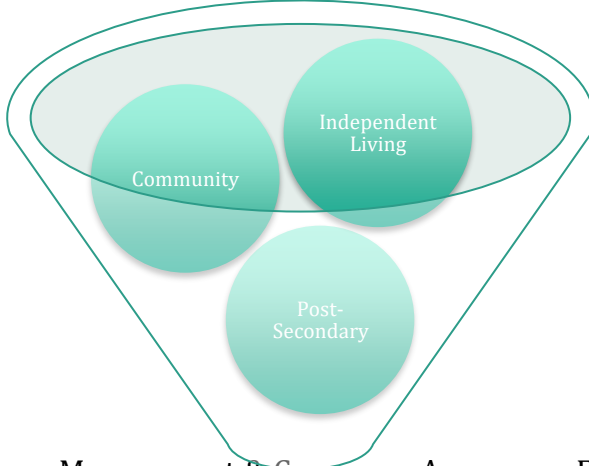


Keiser University Independent Living Skills Assessment (KUILSA)
